Stephen Bennett is an award-winning documentary director known for securing unprecedented access, crafting an intimate shooting style that brings viewers directly into the lives of his subjects.

With three decades of experience, he has created premium documentaries for major broadcasters including BBC, Sky, Channel 4, Channel 5, NHK (Japan), Stan. Originals (Australia), and History (USA).

Stephen has built his reputation by tackling challenging subjects with sensitivity and depth. His films have changed Public Policy three times.

He made history as the first UK director permitted to film and identify children in the Care system. His "Dunblane: Our Story," commemorating the 20th anniversary, featured the first survivor ever to speak on camera.

His powerful storytelling has been nominated for an Orwell Prize and earned him Best Feature Documentary, three BAFTA Scotland Awards, three CELTIC TORCS, and four RTS Awards.

His documentary photography has been nominated for Scottish Portrait Awards.

His documentary "Eminent Monsters," described by the Sunday Times as a "terrifying masterpiece," examined the history of psychological torture and directly influenced the United Nations to launch its first campaign against such practices.

His Darren McGarvey's Class Wars series was rated in The Guardian's global Best TV of 2021 alongside Its a Sin and Line of Duty.

In "War and Justice: The Case of Marine A," Stephen explored the complex case of the first British soldier convicted of murder on a foreign battlefield since World War II, earning praise from The Guardian as "forensically produced and gripping".

His Storyville documentary "Keeping It Up" examined the accidental discovery and cultural impact of Viagra, achieving one of the strand's highest Audience Appreciation scores and winning both Best Documentary: Science and Best Director Unscripted at the 2024 Royal Television Society Scotland Awards.

Stephen continues to produce groundbreaking work, with two major documentaries releasing in 2025: "The Tattooist's Son: Journey to Auschwitz," marking the 80th anniversary of the Liberation of Auschwitz, and "Lockerbie: Our Story," an intimate portrait of grief following families affected by the Pan Am 103 bombing.
